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Race report 007 for: Rounds 13 & 14 – Snetterton – 01/02 Sept 2012

#### Introduction

This has been a period of much activity by our rival championships and the MSA. Firstly, the MSA are looking to impose a control tyre scenario on us without the courtesy of even asking anyone involved whether it is desirable or wanted. The Fiesta ST has been developed with the Dunlop slick tyre right from the beginning when it was first regulated in the Fiesta Championship many years ago. To date it has never been the cause of any mishap in use. In Fiesta Junior it appears that the MSA were content to let the Juniors run on Dunlop slick tyres in 2012 but, suddenly, it becomes undesirable for 2013. This is an outrageous and totally arbitrary decision which fly's in the face of natural justice, good manners and many other things besides. At present I have requested the BRSCC to take up the fight for Fiesta Junior and emphasise that this 2012 season has been conducted with all drivers making superb use of and becoming fully tuned-in to the Dunlop slick tyres. Slick tyres most of the drivers have been used to in their many years of racing in karting.

It was announced by the 750 Motor Club (or via Autosport etc.) that the SaxMax Junior Championship will fold at the end of this season. The Ginetta Junior Championship is willingly going on to 'treaded tyres' in 2013 on the alleged basis that it will be cheaper for competitors who have been reportedly been charged just short of £1000 (that is one thousand pounds by Michelin) for FOUR tyres. This information is direct from a connected source. Quite why approaches have been made to nearly all Fiesta Junior drivers from a person connected with a driver who has been competing in Ginetta Junior is perhaps understandable and I suppose is a compliment to Fiesta Junior.

Our championship represents real value for money and the driver gets the chance to drive in a front wheel drive saloon car which is still described by several current BTCC drivers as the perfect car to learn on before going up the ladder. In restrained economic times, everyone must look at the way their motorsport funding may be best used. I submit that there is no argument, Fiesta Junior is the most complete and cost effective way for any 14 – 16 year old to go motor racing! I have been approached by another 7 people since this Snetterton weekend of racing with a view to build and race cars in 2013. This figure will increase and we will see the anticipated 14 + cars out in 2013. This is not bull, but based on the cold call enquiries I am getting. We do not need to get into a contest with the supremoes of any other junior championship. There is no reason to do so. Our talking will be done by cars on the 2013 grids. I think that the requests to our young drivers to consider going for tests or races are a testament to how seriously we must be rated as opposition. We are not in a contest with them, just wish to run in our own club championship manner.

In view of the manner in which contacts have been forthcoming to our drivers, I have had to remove the person(s) concerned form our email database as I feel it inappropriate to let those people know what we are doing for 2013. They may find out the same as everyone else in the media when we release it.

#### Race 1

What they describe as a lack of substantial numbers is compensated by the high level of driving ability – even from those who were racing for the first time in their Fiesta ST cars shod on Dunlop slick tyres.



(He tested but a family commitment prevented young Mr Bourne from racing this weekend.)

A twelve lap race over the near 2 mile circuit would test the young gentlemen. The clear and dry bright conditions were a bonus given previous races. Red lights out and off and away they went. Ladell made a brilliant start with Wilcox getting some first gear wheelspin which allowed the yellow Ross car to ease by on the way to Riches. A bit of contact? between Wilcox and Moffat on the entry then Moffat was through. A long plume of anti-oil dust along the run to Montreal and Wilcox ran slightly wide and the orange projectile piloted by Mitchell saw him get by for 4th and the same moment saw Skriczka though. Loads more dust on Bentley straight as Wilcox slip-streamed Skriczka then pulled out to pass. Through Brundle and Bomb Hole the order was Ladell, Ross, Moffat, Mitchell and Wilcox followed by Reed and Collingbourne. Into Murrays and all avoided the thick trail of oil dust here to complete the end of lap 1. Wilcox slowly reeled in Mitchell as they crossed the line and heading for Riches for the second time Mitchell sportingly gave room for the faster car to go by. Along the Bentley straight, Wilcox again seemed to have the legs of the proceeding Moffat car but was only able to draw up to the back of the young Scot as they went into Brundle. It was evident that Wilcox could carry a shade more speed into the bend and on braking slightly later. Over they went for the start of lap 2. Along Senna straight Wilcox again drew up to Moffat and just simply drive around him for 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Into Montreal and another contact(s) just shy of the apex between Wilcox ahead of Moffat which spun and slowed both cars allowing Skriczka and Mitchell though. Moffat had

right nearside wheel damage which left him stranded and as Wilcox drove off the outside grass he

was then passed by Reed.



As they completed another lap the full course yellows came out for the safety car. The whole field did eventually bunch up as the recovery truck scooped up the Moffat ST. A good lesson here from the young heads on the importance of keeping up to the leaders so as not to lose out on the re-start. Lap 7 and the race resumed with Ladell leading the bunch of young tigers. I have to reiterate the way the re-start was conducted and perhaps I will

put footage on video to demonstrate the 'how to do it' mode. Text book stuff – well done our junior drivers! Around Montreal and Mitchell and Skriczka were battling close and fair which allowed Wilcox who had got by Reed to close up too. Incredibly, Wilcox just drove by the two cars along Bentley straight to take up 3<sup>rd</sup> place and he could see Ladell and Ross just two hundred yards ahead. Getting to 3<sup>rd</sup> may have been ok, but trying to gain on Ladell and Ross seemed a tough ask as his lap times show on the last four laps with the gap to Ross and fairly constant 5 seconds. At the chequered flag and another faultless drive from the WDE prepped ST driver Charlie Ladell. Second and well deserved 2<sup>nd</sup> was James Ross with Ben Wilcox third.

### Race 2



Well, this was going to be another cracker and they had 14 laps to go this time. Red lights out and good starts from Ladell and Ross and Mitchell and Wilcox with Reed keeping up as they went towards Riches but soon getting swamped by Moffat to his nearside and Skriczka to the off. Moffat took a neat inside line to take a place then into Montreal he nipped right under Mitchell and Skriczka



for 4<sup>th</sup>. Ladell led them along Bentley with Ross and Wilcox behind and these just ahead of Moffat. Reed had the legs of Mitchell down here and looked at moving by Skriczka, but a hesitant gearchange kept him back. A gap now from third to fourth and then to sixth placed Skriczka. Around Coram, Mitchell reclaimed the Reed place for 6<sup>th</sup>. Approaching the line it was obvious that Moffat had slowed but then came back. Lap 4 and Wilcox had taken second place from Ross before the Bomb Hole only to get crossed up as he got the Coram apex. The slide was gentle but devastating as the back flicked out one way then the other leaving Wilcox on the outside grass – stationary. All up to Skriczka went by and then as he tugged at the gear change Moffat took advantage and zipped by as they went up the Senna straight. It took until lap 6 for the earlier off to get better as he outragged Moffat along Bentley for the 4<sup>th</sup> spot. Meanwhile at the front it was service as normal as Ladell went about his work confidentially and well with Ross some 5 -6 seconds behind him Skriczka was about the same gap back as was Wilcox from him. The only other change of place happened on lap 11 when Wilcox claimed Skriczka's 3<sup>rd</sup> place. The chequered flag was waved after 1fourteen laps and Charlie Ladell took the honours from James Ross and Ben Wilcox.
